RICH FRUIT CAKE

| 250g (8oz) currants | 125g (4oz) chopped mixed peel |
| 90g (3oz) chopped red cherries | 90g (3oz) chopped blanched almonds |
| 1/3 cup sherry or brandy | 250g (8oz) plain flour |
| 60g (2oz) self raising flour | 4 large eggs |
| 1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg | 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger |
| 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves | 250g (8oz) butter |
| 1/2 teaspoon almond essence | 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence |
| 250g (8oz) soft brown sugar | |
| 1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind | |

Mix together all the fruits & nuts & sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover & leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.
 Sift together the flours & spices. Cream together the butter & sugar with the essences.

Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit & flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8") & bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 1/2 – 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Note: To ensure uniformity & depending upon the size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2-3 pieces; cherries into 4-6 pieces; almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.
