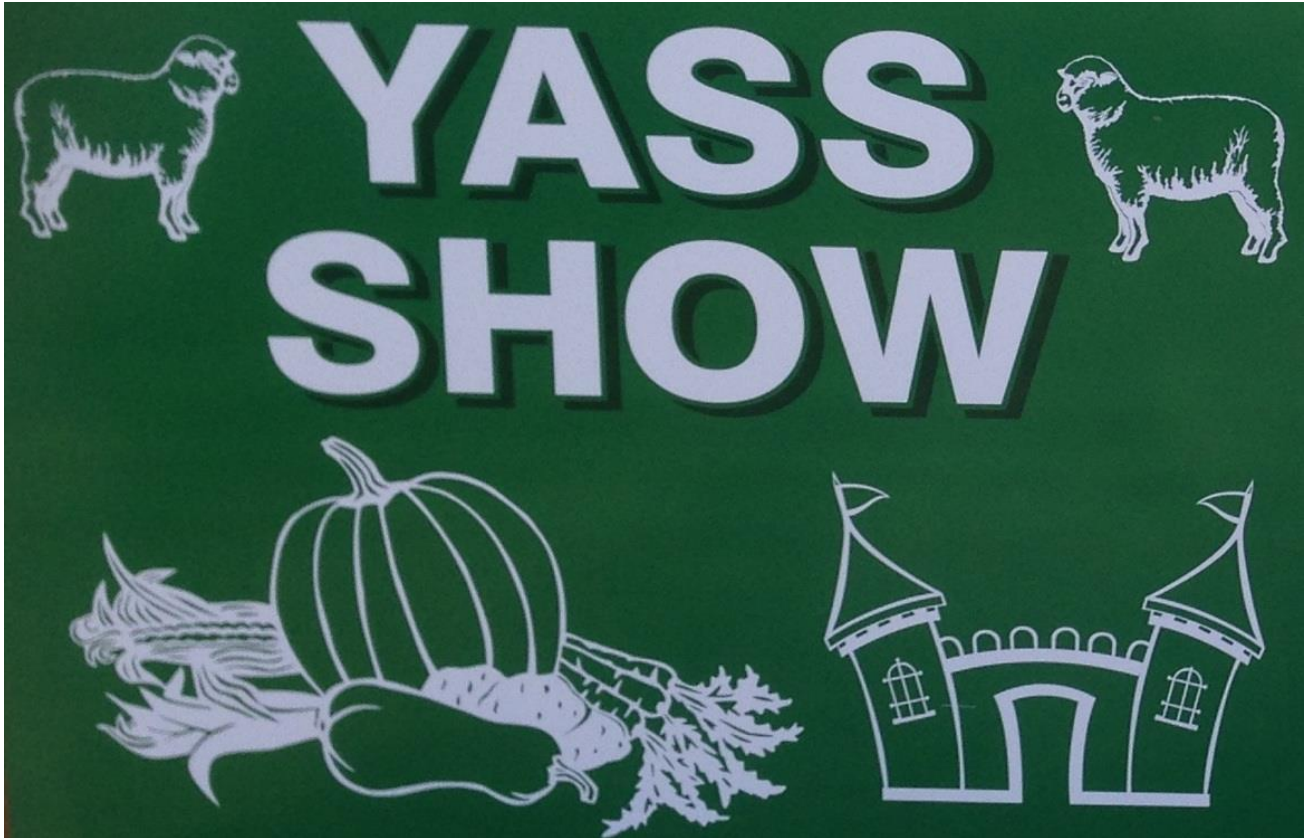

- C. The Yass Show Society Inc will exercise all care with exhibits, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage whilst in its custody.
- D. Class division will be made if entries are sufficient or at judge's discretion.
- E. Collection of work must be made promptly after 4.30pm on Sunday 10th April 2016 under strict Steward supervision.
- F. Exhibits must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor, done within the last 18 months, not copied or hung at a previous Yass Show.
- G. The entry form and back of the work must be endorsed with the *title, medium, artist's name, sale price if for sale, or if not for sale –NFS*. The Yass Show Society Inc will retain 20% on sales.
- H. Due to restricted space, an exhibitor may enter no more than 2 entries in a class and they may not exceed 100 x 75cm in size.

Regulations for Section C – PLEASE READ CAREFULLY.

- a. Exhibits to be made or produced by the exhibitor. If requested, a declaration to this effect must be made by the exhibitor or parent/guardian (exhibitor under 18yrs). All exhibits – Open & Junior – to be individual efforts only.
- b. Where icing is specified, tops must be iced, **NOT SIDES**.
- c. All cakes must be exhibited on a flat piece of **FOIL COVERED HARD BOARD, 2.5cm** larger than the exhibit.
- d. Children’s commercial biscuits, scones, pikelets, to be exhibited on a **17cm/7” plate ONLY. Scone cutter size 5cms ONLY. No fluted cutters to be used.**
- e. Exhibitor tickets **MUST** be securely fastened & visible. Stewards **WILL NOT** be responsible for tickets not fastened properly.
- f. Exhibits **NOT** to be covered with plastic wrap. Exhibits delivered to the Grandstand by Thursday 7th April, may be loosely covered for protection.
- g. Sponges to be 4 eggs only.
- h. **No ring or tapered tins** to be used.
- i. ‘Most Successful Exhibitor’ - Open or Junior – must have at least 3 entries, in different classes, to be eligible.
- j. **No prize money will be awarded, if there is only one entry in a class.**
- k. All exhibits to be collected, under Stewards supervision, after **4.30pm on Sunday 10th April 2016.**

- 40. ASC of NSW Rich Fruit Cake – compulsory for all entrants. **No tapered tin to be used.**

ASC RICH FRUIT CAKE RECIPE.

125g chopped mixed peel	250g butter
250g chopped raisins	4 large eggs
250g sultanas	half teaspoon ground cloves
250g currants	half teaspoon ground ginger
250g plain flour	quarter teaspoon nutmeg
90g chopped red cherries	1/3 cup sherry or brandy
90g chopped blanched almonds	half teaspoon almond essence
60g self raising flour	half teaspoon vanilla essence
250g soft brown sugar	half teaspoon lemon essence or finely grated lemon rind

Mix together all the fruits & nuts. Sprinkle with sherry or brandy. Cover & leave at least one hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours & spices. Cream together the butter & sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit & flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm in length, breadth or diameter. Bake in slow oven for approximately three half to four hours. Allow to cool in the tin.

Note: To ensure uniformity & depending upon the size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4 to 6 pieces; almonds crosswise into 3 to 4 pieces.

DECORATED CAKES

- b. Cleats (feet) must be attached to underside of presentation board, for ease of handling.
- c. Presentation board must not exceed 45cm square or diameter

- e. **PERMITTED:** wire, tape, tulle, fabric ribbon, braid, cord, stamens & manufactured pillars.
- f. **NOT PERMITTED:** Manufactured ornaments, flowers, leaves, computer imaging, dried stems of any kind, HOBBY GLUE as an attaching medium.
